MUSTAFA KEMAL ATATÜRK'S ADDRESS TO THE TURKISH YOUTH

Turkish youth! Your first duty is forever to preserve , and defend the Turkish Independence and The Turkish Republic.

This is the very foundation of your most precious treasure. In the future ,too, there may be malevolent people at home and abroad, who will wish to deprive you of this treasure. If one day you are compelled to defend your independence, and your Republic, you must not tarry to weigh the possibilities and circumstances of the situation before taking up your duty. These possibilities and circumstances may turn out to be extremely unfavourable. The enemies conspiring against your independence and your Republic, may have behind them a victory unprecedented in the annals of the world.

It may be that, by violence, and ruse, all the fortresses of your beloved motherland may be captured, all her shipyards occupied, all her armies dispersed, and every part of the country invaded. And sadder and graver than all these circumstances, those who hold power within the country may be in error, misguided, and even may be traitors. Further more, they may identify their personal interests with the political designs of the invaders. The country may be impoverished, ruined and exhausted.

Youth of Turkey's future, even in such circumstances, it is your duty to save the Turkish Independence and Republic. You find the strength you need in your nobel blood.

Mustafa Kemal

Kemal Atatürk was born in Salonika, in 1881. His father died when he was only seven, and the family was left almost penniless. Mustafa did well in school and his teacher gave him a second name; Kemal, meaning "perfection". Mustafa went to the army academy when he was 12 and was commissioned an officer in the army at 21. While he was still a young officer, he formed a secret committee to fight government corruption.

Even before World War I, the Ottoman Empire was breaking up: Austria sized parts of the Balkans. Bulgaria declared its independence. Italy captured what is now Libya. During World War I, Turkey joined the Germans. At the end of the war, the Empire was stopped of its territories, and the Allies were making plans to come up Turkey itself into independent states and occupied territories. But Mustafa; now a general in the Turkish Army, had to support all the Turkish People: He drove back the Allied forces. The Sultan fled the country to save his life. He founded the Republic of Turkey and served as its President from 1923 until his death. Later he was called Gazi Mustafa Kemal. The Turkish Grand National Assembly gave him the surname Atatürk, which means "Father Turk" or "Father of Turks" in 1933.

At once he began reforming Turkey. Amazing reforms in the Turkish political social, economic, and religious life took place under his forceful leadership. He gave Turkish women their freedom and abolished such customs as the harem the veil and the fez. He outlawed polygamy. He eliminated corruption, improved public education and introduced the Roman alphabet for the Turkish language. His government encouraged the development of banks and new industries.

Six principles guided Mustafa Kemal in leading his people into the modern political

world; Nationalism, secularism, populism, statism, republicanism, and revolutionism.

Nationalism meant a national consciousness a sense that all within the boarders Turkey no matter what their origin, their appearance or, their beliefs-were Turks. All should regard themselves as Turks and, theoretically, all would be treated alike in law and in practice.

Secularism meant separation of the government and organized religion.


Populism meant the popular will. Reforms were justified by stating that the Grand National Assembly was the agent of the people and expressed the popular will in legislative and executive reform.

Republicanism referred to the form of representative elected government.

Statism was concerned mostly with upgrading the economy of the nation through massive grants of state aid and training of experts in management. The nationalization of railroads, ships, banks, and other industries such as the manufacture of tobacco, matches, sold, alcohol and sugar was accomplished under this principle.

Revolutionism was the expression of an attitude of mind to make and accept changes in the political, social, and economic life of the individual and the whole people in order that the country might proceed quickly to the fulfillment of its modern goals.

He died at 9.05 a m , November 10, 1938. If you are ever in Turkey on the morning of November 10, you will be startled at 9.05 by the piercing shriek of sirens. Flags will drop to half-staff. Every radio will go death. You will see every car on the street stop where it is, and every pedestrian, too. There will be 5 minutes of silence in honour of Ataturk. In every Turkish town and city that silence is kept.



Erciyes, one of the most important centers for winter sports and mountaineering, is 30 km to the South of Kayseri. The skirun is one of the best in the world.

The direct length of the ski-runs is 3200m. The facilities are in service with two lifts and babylifts.

Erciyes is also used as a tracking course in summer months as well as mountain and glacial clims. Erciyes has combined music, entertainment and sports together with festival of snow particles and this has already been made traditional. The mountain is also for its white horses that survive in their natural habitat.

Tekir Plateau where the ski-runs take place, with its unbeliavably attractive natural beauties, is used as a picnic area in summer as well as in winter.

Nomadic people who move up to Tekir Plateau and its surroundings in summer months and Tekir honey are among indispensible opportunities Erciyes offer.

Erciyes, which is always accessable, offers its opportunities to its visitors in every season.



"Just wait until your father gets home."



CLOTHES

The period of occurrence of cutting-out clothes are believed to date from the IX century.

Roman tunic is the most ancient dress tailored from rectangular piece of fabric.

The first attempts to cut clothes over the form of a human body have appeared in the East, but have not received sufficient development. More favorable conditions were in Europe when people have wished to emphasize the shapes of body.

For this purpose medieval masters of XII century made cuts on each side of dress and connected edges with lacing. But clothes were still monolithic.

It is supposed that the idea of dividing dress into parts were adopted from inventors of knightly armor.

The dress with sewn-in sleeves appeared approximately in XIII century; with collars in XIV and with pockets in XVII.

By cross seam dress was divided into bodice and skirt. New look of wear maintained with insignificant changes from XVI to XIX centuries. The bases of this dress were the skirt on the special dense cover with hoops of different sizes and corset

New type of clothes common for all estates appeared after French Revolution (1789). The elements of folk dress striked to men's clothes (long tight pants, short waistcoat). Even tail-coat and dinner jacket descend from outdoor clothes of English peasants. Women got rid of tight corset (though it became fashionable again and preserved till twenties of XX century).

From the evidence of magazine "The Art of Tailor" (1908, #1) first system of cutting was invented by Frenchman Michael. In 1831 it was changed by scale system. Before clothes were made only by "patterns" which were the properties of family (father handed down it to his son).

The introduction of sewing machines in last decades of XIX century brought to raising the productivity of labor and to complication of shapes of cutting details. The shapes and design was changed, skirt was shortened and the century-old dress was replaced by practical clothes from 2 or 3 parts (skirt, blouse, jacket).

In 1928 Coco Chanel brought into women's fashion the suit of men's type.






